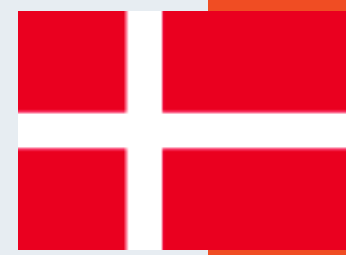

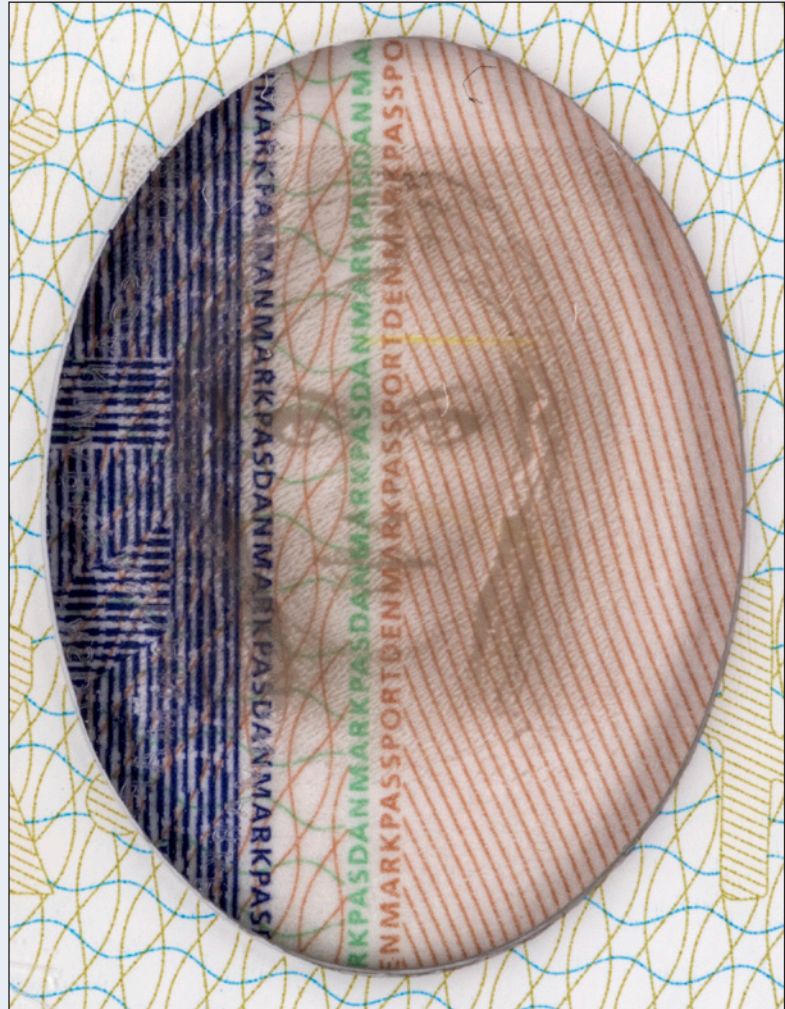

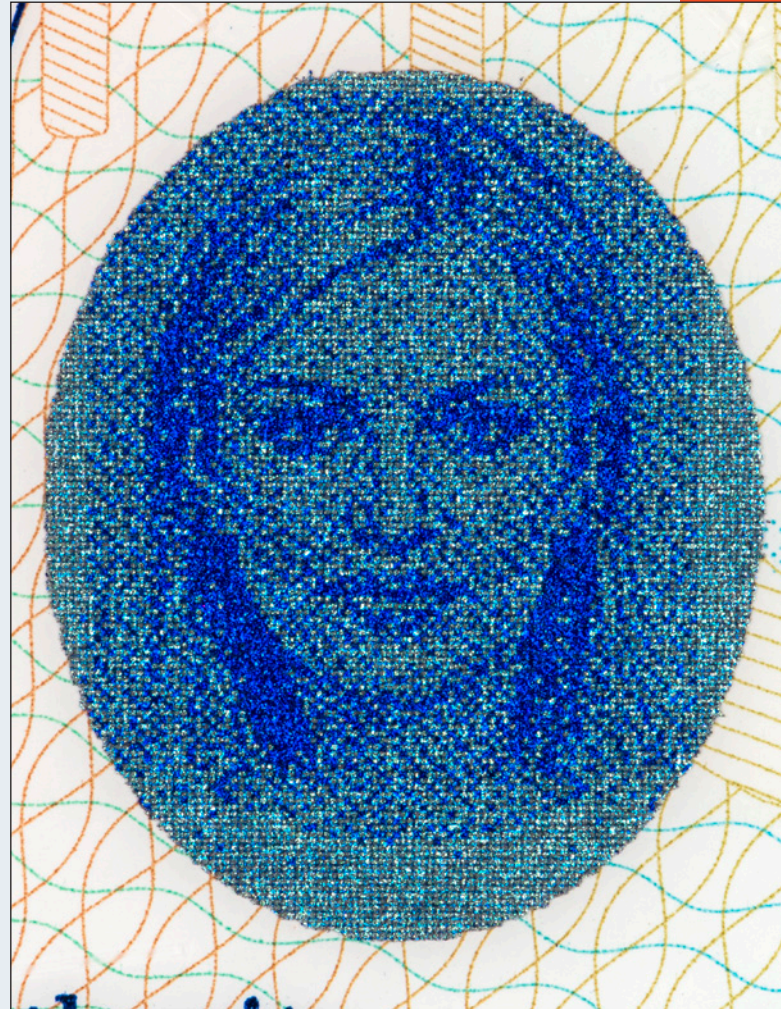
Clear Window

A transparent window in a synthetic or hybrid substrate.



Photo repetition

The photograph of the document holder is repeated once, or more often.



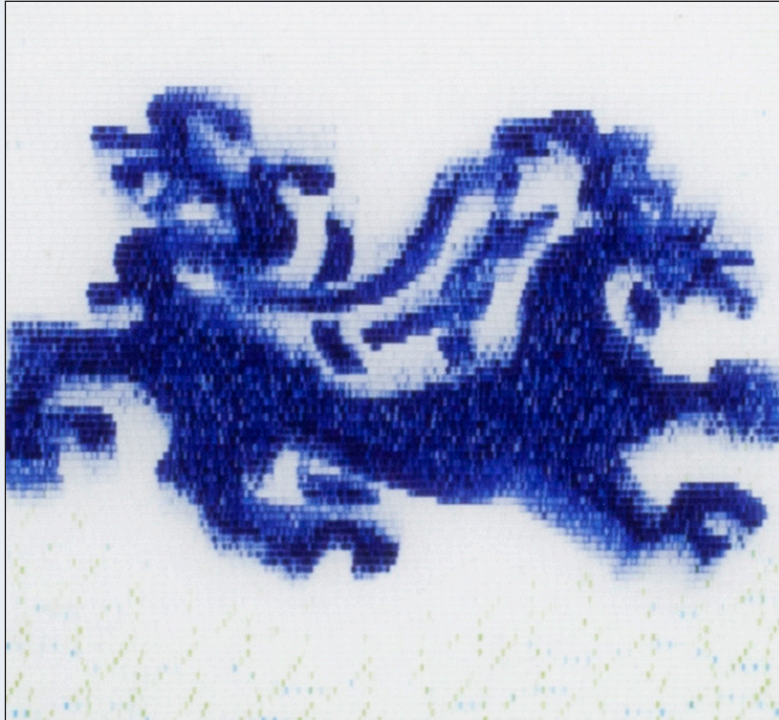
Fuse-ID

Fuse-ID is a patch of optically variable ink (OVI) combined with a laser engraved photo of the document holder.



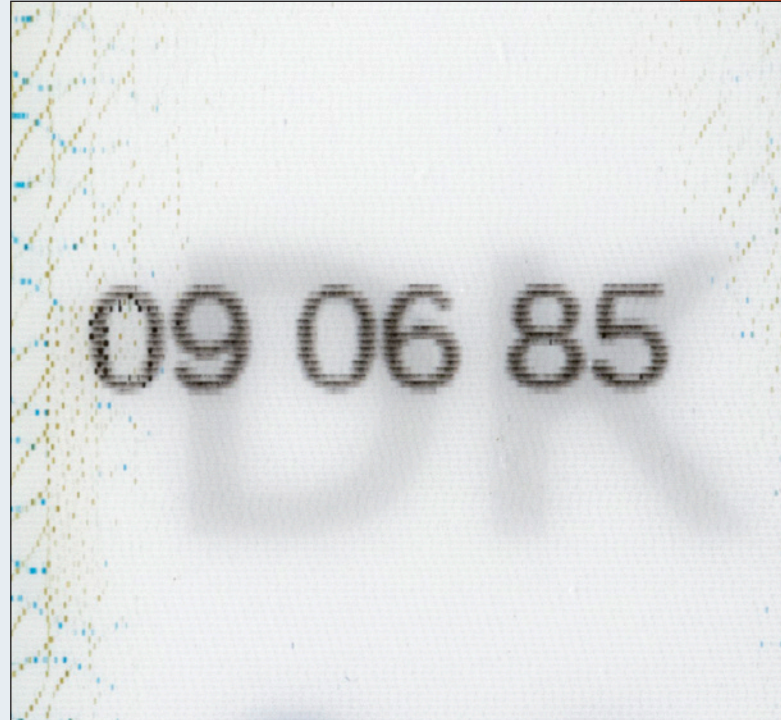
Diffraction Optical Variable Image Device (DOVID)

An optically variable feature composed of grids that diffract light. This allows various images and effects to be generated, including colour changes (shifts) as well as 2D and 3D images.



Magic ID

A multiple imaging technology consisting of pre-printed and specifically arranged pixels in combination with lens structures. Depending on the viewing angle, a dynamic movement can be seen.



Multiple Laser Image (MLI)

A laser-generated optically variable image, composed of horizontal lines.

The Danish passport is a highly secured ID document and includes, among others; Fuse-ID, clear window with photo, Diffraction Optical Variable Image Device (DOVID) and Multiple Laser Image (MLI) with the date of birth and the letters DK.

Inside back cover

In the front and back cover of this passport are two sides of the Jelling stone printed in intaglio. The large rune stone was erected by King Harald Bluetooth in the year 965 and is referred to as “Denmark’s birth certificate” marking the country’s transition to Christianity.
